At present we have 168 affiliated schools in Kerala of which 132 are our active ASISC members. Somehow few of the schools haven't registered yet for membership with us. I thank all the school Principals for their active participation and cooperation in all the activities of the Association.

Results 2020

We are proud to acknowledge and appreciate all the schools for their earnest interest and care they are giving to our students and prepare them well for the board examinations. I congratulate the management, Principals, Teachers, Staff and students in all their achievements. This year due to the pandemic challenge the annual result has been integrated and the Council published it considering the overall performance and achievement of the students. So the Council decided not to publish any rank list, in this context I am not attempting to mention any schools or individual students but I congratulate all the top scoring students of the schools and their Principals. The overall results of Kerala both in ICSE and ISC were about 99.4 percentages. It is a real achievement.

Rangotsav – 2019

The cultural fest, 'Rangotsav - 2019', was conducted on 4th and 5th of October 2019 at KE School, Mannanam with much festivity and gaiety. We should all

ASISC scholarship

This year 100 schools participated in the ASISC Scholarship examination which was held on 22nd November 2019 from 10:00 am to 11:30 am. 24564 students registered, and 24364 students wrote the examination. Congratulation to all the participants and medal winners. The ASISC diamond star award for registering maximum number of students was bagged by St. Joseph's Public School, Pattanakkadu for registering 2074 students for ASISC scholarship examination. The Golden star award for the first runner up went to Holy Trinity AI school, Thevalakkara for registering 1452 students and the Silver star award was received by Sarvodaya Vidyalaya, Nalanchira for registering 1412 students. Congratulations to all the winners.

Teachers training

With the support of the CISCE, the Association conducted five residential training programmes for primary teachers, three in Don Bosco school, Vaduthala and two in Sarvodaya Vidyalaya, Trivandrum. The average attendance for the training was above 60. The participants appreciated the program and reported that it benefited to them. The expenditure for the training was borne by the Kerala Association. I specially thank Mrs. Anu Arora, the education officer at Calcutta office for helping me to organize this event.

Special training for English

Annual financial statement

Kollaveli & Co Trivandrum and they have submitted to us and that is enclosed in the folder given to you for your perusal and I am presenting the same before the house for approval.

Due to the unfortunate outbreak of the Covid-19 the internal audit couldn't be completed on time. In consultation with our honourable President, the matter had been intimated to our internal auditors and taken their verbal approval to hand it over to our chartered accountant.

We have conducted two general body meetings and five executive board meetings during the current year for deliberating and discussing the various activities of our Association. I earnestly thank and appreciate the support, cooperation of all our executive board members all the Principals, managers, staff and students who are the real beneficiaries of the activities of our Association. All the decisions and deliberations have been effectively implemented during this academic year.
